Transfer Honors College Requirements

The U of A Honors College offers options for admission to transfer students, as well as current U of A students. To be eligible to enter the Honors College, students must have a GPA of:

- 3.75 or higher for Sam M. Walton College of Business*
- 3.5 or higher for College of Engineering, Fay Jones School of Architecture and Design, Dale Bumpers College of Agricultural, Food and Life Sciences, Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, and College of Education and Health Professions

Requires one (1) semester at the U of A prior to application.

Who is eligible to study abroad?

University of Arkansas students who are in good academic standing and who have completed at least 24 credit hours with the U of A are eligible to look into study abroad. Every study abroad program may have its own requirements beyond these basics, so check the program application for more on the specific expectations for your program.

How do I fund my study abroad?

Most of the scholarships and financial aid that you currently receive at the University of Arkansas may be used to study abroad on an approved study abroad program. In addition, there are multiple funding opportunities for non-Honors and Honors students through colleges, departments, and special funding sources for U of A students.



Northwest Arkansas

The University of Arkansas is home to one of the most successful intercollegiate athletics programs in the nation. With 19 varsity sports programs, the Razorbacks consistently rank among the best in the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and nationally.

Razorback student-athletes also succeed both on the field and in the classroom. In 2022-23, Arkansas won two NCAA and five SEC championships and for the third-consecutive year ranked in the top-15 of the Learfield Directors' Cup, a competition that tracks the most successful athletics programs in the country. In 2022-23, 98 percent of Razorback student-athletes that completed their athletics eligibility also added their names to Senior Walk as graduates of the University of Arkansas.

Admission

Transfer students applying to the University of Arkansas for the fall semester are urged to start the application process by January 15. Applications for the spring semester should be started in August.

Admission Process

Complete and submit an online application at transfer.uark.edu.

Spring semester: Apply by December 15.

Summer semester: Apply by May 1.

Fall semester: Apply by August 1.

Send official college transcript(s) from all institutions attended. Electronic PDF transcripts should be sent directly from the service provider to registra@uark.edu. Please allow two weeks for processing time.

Dual enrollment or concurrent coursework does count as hours towards admission, but AP, IB, and CLEP do not. Financial Assistance

- 1 Apply early for university scholarships.
- In addition to institutional and departmental scholarships, search for private aid through local businesses, civic groups, and places of worship. Check websites such as <u>fastweb.com</u> for lists of additional scholarships.
- 3 Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to be considered for federal student aid. New students should submit the FAFSA no later than the scholarship deadlines posted to be considered for need-based scholarship awards, such as the Advance Arkansas scholarship. Go to <u>fafsa.gov</u> and use the University of Arkansas code: 001108. Spring 2024 applicants should complete the 2023-2024 FAFSA, while summer/fall 2024 applicants should complete the 2024-2025 FAFSA.
- Receive your award notice from the University of Arkansas, which may include grants, loans and work-study, as well as merit-based awards and scholarships. This notice may not include all awards.

Transfer Scholarships

The University of Arkansas has over \$1.5 million in scholarships available to transfer students admitted in the fall and spring.

To be considered for U of A Transfer Scholarships, entering transfer students must have completed or be in the process of completing at least 24 or more transferable hours of college-level work from a regionally accredited institution of higher education other than the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. **Applicants must have completed a minimum of 12 transferable hours at the time of application.**

To apply for academic scholarships at the University of Arkansas, you must first apply for admission.
