Financial aid is divided into categories of grants, work, loans, and scholarships. Unless otherwise specified, a student needs to complete only three forms to apply for all four basic types of assistance: The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the University's Application for Admission, and the general scholarship application. These forms collect information used by the Office of Financial Aid and the University's scholarship committees in determining awards. In some cases, copies of the parents' and/or student's tax returns are needed.
