IMPORTANT DATES:

DURING YOUR JUNIOR YEAR

- Visit campus or attend a college preview day. Find more information at visit.uark.edu.
- Find a time to take the ACT or SAT: Not all students take the ACT or SAT in their junior year, but it can be a good time to start preparing for testing during your senior year. Find more information about test dates at act.org or collegeboard.org.

SENIOR YEAR

- **JULY 15** – Start your application for admission at admissions.uark.edu. Applying early means the earliest access to housing and orientation options when we begin admitting students in September.
 - **SEPTEMBER** – Check the mail! We will start sending our first admission notifications to students this month.
 - **OCTOBER 1** – Start the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the upcoming year. Find more information (and help) at finaid.uark.edu.
 - **NOVEMBER 1** – Submit an application for admission by the priority deadline. This is the best way to be considered for the most scholarship opportunities and take advantage of early options for housing and new student orientation.
 - **NOVEMBER 15** – Submit a scholarship application by the priority scholarship deadline.
- The majority of scholarships are awarded during the priority round. Learn more about scholarship opportunities at scholarships.uark.edu.
- **DECEMBER 1** – Submit your FAFSA by this date to receive the most consideration for need-based and merit aid.
 - **FEBRUARY 1** – Apply for scholarships and fellowships and send in all supporting materials by the final scholarship deadline.

MAKE THE GRADE

UNDERSTANDING GPAS, TEST SCORES, AND TRANSCRIPTS:

When you apply to the University of Arkansas, we consider your grades and test scores to make an admissions decision for you.

This means that the classes you take (and how well you do in them) could have a big impact on your college choices. Consider taking Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate or dual credit courses, if you qualify. These classes can give a boost to your GPA and you might even qualify for college credit. After you apply, ask your high school counselor to send us an official transcript. You can also request that ACT or College Board send your official test scores directly to the Office of Admissions. Keep in mind – it's a good idea to send us more than one test score. We superscore and will use your highest scores for admission purposes.

INFORMATION ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID:

Paying for college is a big investment, and we can help you make a plan to make college as affordable as possible.

The U of A offers scholarships to our incoming freshmen, ranging from prestigious fellowships to one-time awards that help you cover the cost of housing or books. Be sure to keep track of deadlines for applying for scholarships, and make sure you understand all the materials required. Some scholarships require letters of recommendation, so make sure you give your recommenders plenty of advance notice.

The Office of Financial Aid can guide you through the process of applying for state and federal aid using the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

Once you're on campus, you will have access to scholarships specifically for current students, as well as funding for study abroad, research, internships, and more.

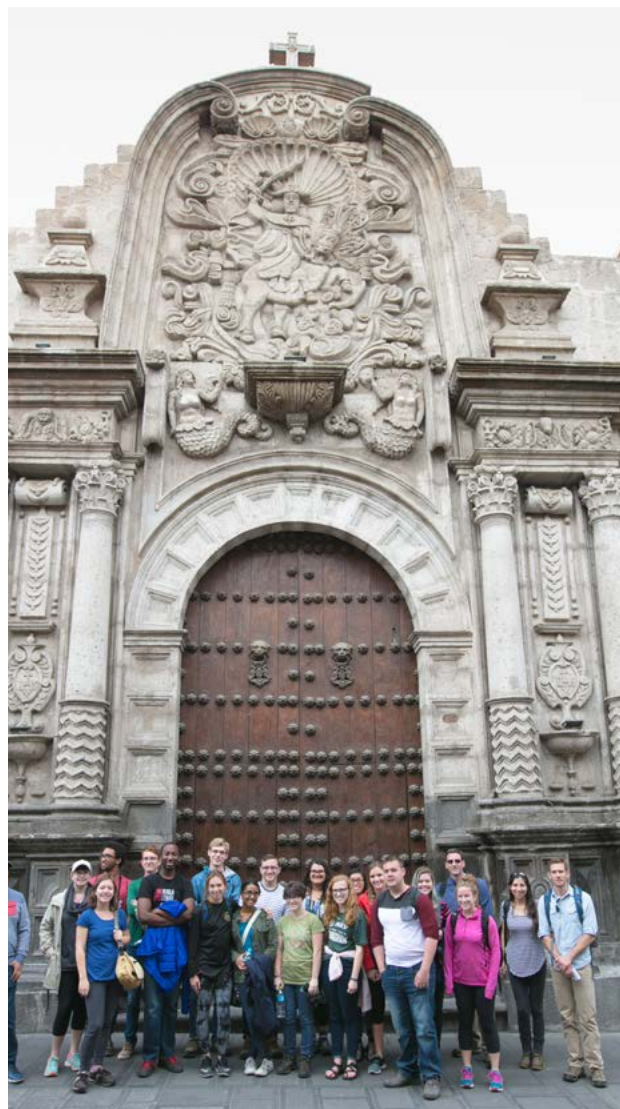


FIND A CAREER, FIND A CALLING
