

HOME OF THE RAZORBACKS®


The Razorbacks have established one of the most successful athletics programs in the country, winning 53 national championships. The university's eight men's and 11 women's varsity sports host more than 200 events annually.

Arkansas has more than made its mark in the most competitive conference in the nation. The Razorbacks have secured a top-20 national finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup Standings in five-consecutive years. Arkansas has won eight NCAA titles and 39 Southeastern Conference team championships in the past seven years, including 31 conference titles in the past five years alone.

In 2024-25, a total of 102 Razorback student-athletes earned their degrees. The program also achieved a 100% Razorback Graduation Rate, which is based on student-athletes who complete their athletics eligibility and earn their degree.

The Arkansas Razorbacks don't just represent the University of Arkansas – they are the pride of the entire state. The Hog Call is one of the most unique and recognizable chants in all of sports. And it's loud – really loud!





STUDY ABROAD

At the University of Arkansas, learning goes beyond the classroom with opportunities to study abroad in locations around the world, including the university's Rome Center, and through programs, such as the Arkansas Global Changemakers.

Students in good academic standing with at least 24 U of A credit hours are eligible to explore study abroad options, though each program may have additional requirements. Most scholarships and financial aid can be used for approved programs, and funding opportunities are available through colleges, departments, and special sources. HOW TO APPLY

Transfer students applying for the fall semester are urged to start the application process by **January 15**. Applications for the spring semester should be started in August.

1. Complete and submit an online application at transfer.uark.edu.

Spring semester: Apply by December 15.

Summer semester: Apply by May 1.

Fall semester: Apply by August 1.

- 2. Send official transcript(s) from all institutions attended. Electronic PDF transcripts should be sent directly from the service provider to registra@uark.edu. Please allow two weeks for processing time.
- **3.** Transfer Freshmen, send your ACT/SAT test scores and high school transcript.

GUIDELINES*

New Transfer (24 or more transferable hours)

- College GPA
 - 2.0 cumulative GPA on all college coursework
- Good academic standing

Transfer Freshman (less than 24 transferable hours)

- College GPA
 - 2.0 cumulative GPA on all college coursework
- Test Optional
 - Applicants with a 3.20 high school GPA or higher (4.00 scale) will be reviewed for admission without a test score
- Test Required
 - Applicants with less than a 3.20 high school GPA should submit ACT, SAT, Next Generation Accuplacer, or Classic Learning Test scores at the time of application

FINANCIAL AID PLANNING

- **1.** Apply early for university scholarships.
- 2. In addition to institutional and departmental scholarships, search for private aid through local businesses, civic groups, and places of worship. Check websites such as **fastweb.com** for lists of additional scholarships.
- 3. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov using the University of Arkansas code 001108 to be considered for federal aid and need-based scholarships like Advance Arkansas. New students should submit the FAFSA by the posted scholarship deadlines. Spring applicants should complete the 2025-2026 FAFSA, while summer and fall 2026 applicants should complete the 2026-2027 FAFSA.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

The University of Arkansas has over \$1.5 million in scholarships available to transfer students admitted in the fall and spring.

To be considered for U of A Transfer Scholarships, entering transfer students must have completed or be in the process of completing 24 or more transferable hours of college-level work from a regionally accredited institution of higher education other than the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 12 transferable hours at the time of application.

To apply, you must first apply for admission and submit the application and all required documents, including official transcripts, by October 1 to be considered for the October 15 spring semester deadline and by March 15 to be considered for the April 1 fall semester deadline.




HONORS COLLEGE













HOUSING
