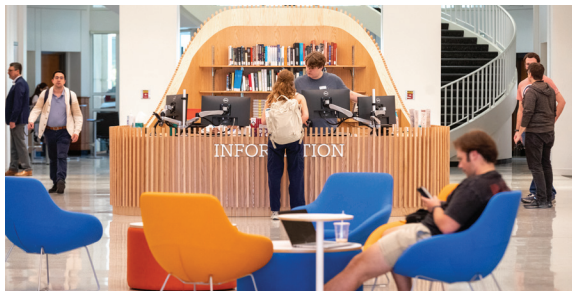

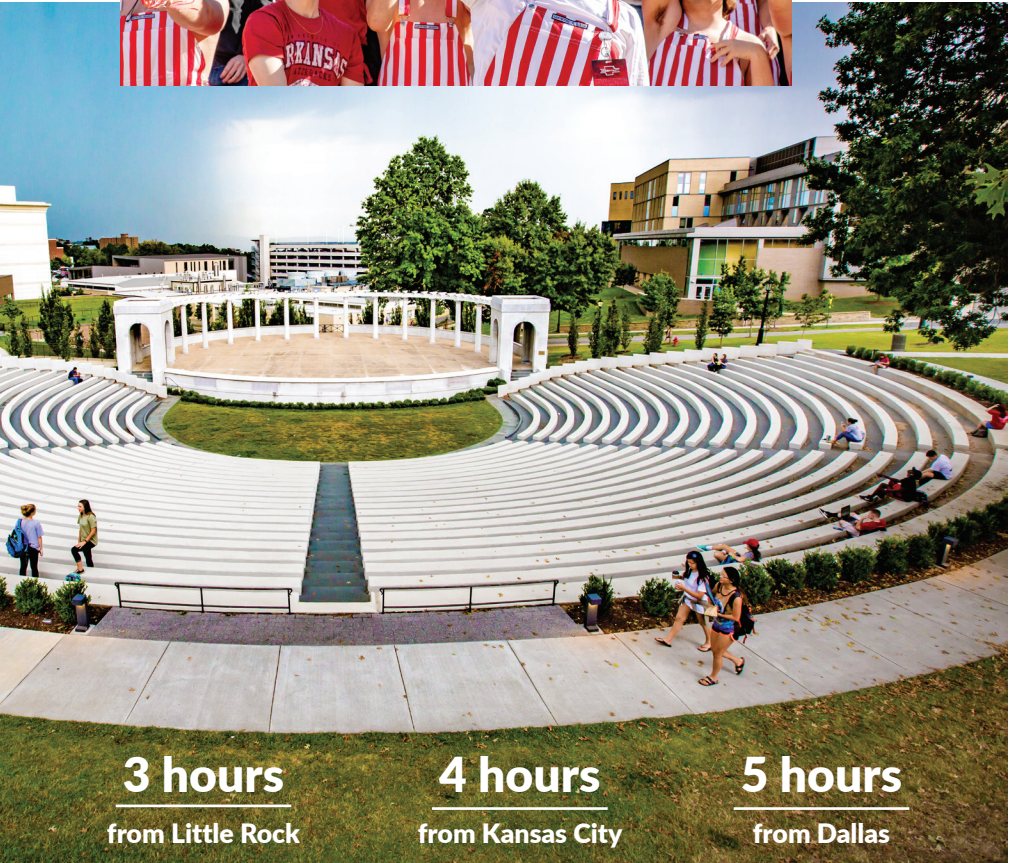

# HOME OF THE RAZORBACKS®

The Razorbacks have established one of the most successful athletics programs in the country, winning 53 national championships. The university's eight men's and 11 women's varsity sports host more than 200 events annually.

Arkansas has more than made its mark in the most competitive conference in the nation. The Razorbacks have secured a top-20 national finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup Standings in five-consecutive years. Arkansas has won eight NCAA titles and 39 Southeastern Conference team championships in the past seven years, including 31 conference titles in the past five years alone.

In 2024-25, a total of 102 Razorback student-athletes earned their degrees. The program also achieved a 100% Razorback Graduation Rate, which is based on student-athletes who complete their athletics eligibility and earn their degree.

The Arkansas Razorbacks don't just represent the University of Arkansas – they are the pride of the entire state. The Hog Call is one of the most unique and recognizable chants in all of sports. And it's loud – really loud!

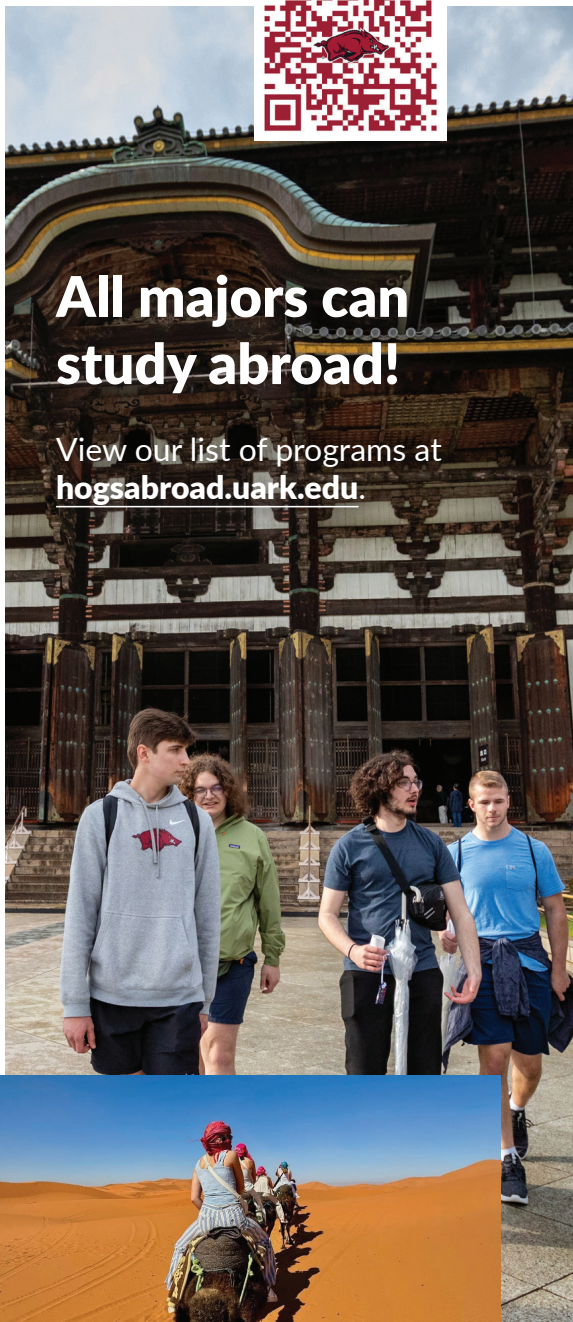




# STUDY ABROAD

# HOW TO APPLY

If you are applying for the fall semester, follow the steps below. The priority application deadline is **November 1**. The final application deadline is **August 1**.

1. Apply at [apply.uark.edu](https://apply.uark.edu) by November 1 for priority scholarship, housing, and orientation options.
2. Ask your high school to send official copies of transcripts showing all previous academic coursework. High school transcripts should be sent through a transcript delivery service or by email to [uofa@uark.edu](mailto:uofa@uark.edu).
3. Submit ACT or SAT scores by February 1 for merit-based scholarships and fellowships; all test scores are due by May 1 for placement.



## GUIDELINES\*

### Test Optional

Applicants with a 3.20 high school GPA or higher (4.00 scale) will be reviewed for admission without a test score.

### Test Required

Applicants with less than a 3.20 high school GPA should submit ACT, SAT, Next Generation Accuplacer, or Classic Learning Test scores at the time of application.

### Non-Residents

Out-of-state applicants may be required to meet higher standards, including holistic review, depending on demand.

- ✓ **Check In:** Watch your email and [appstatus.uark.edu](http://appstatus.uark.edu) for updates.
- ✓ **Immunizations:** Submit records—details at [health.uark.edu/immunizations.php](http://health.uark.edu/immunizations.php).
- ✓ **Housing:** Complete the housing contract or request to live with a guardian. On-campus housing is required for first-year freshmen under 21. [housing.uark.edu](http://housing.uark.edu).
- ✓ **Orientation:** Register at [orientation.uark.edu](http://orientation.uark.edu) to meet advisors, sign up for classes, and prepare for campus life.
- ✓ **Final Transcript:** Ask your high school to send it to the University of Arkansas Office of Admissions.

- JULY 15** **Application Opens.** Complete your admission application early for priority housing and orientation options.
- SEPT.** **Register for the ACT.** Send your scores to the U of A (**0144**) for most merit-based scholarships/fellowships and for placement/enrollment purposes.
- OCT. 1** **FAFSA Opens.** Take the ACT and/or register for the December ACT.
- NOV. 1** **Priority Application Deadline**
- NOV. 15** **Priority Scholarship Application Deadline**
- DEC. 1** **Priority Financial Aid Deadline.** Submit FAFSA to receive priority consideration for financial aid and scholarships. Use the U of A code **001108**. [finaid.uark.edu](http://finaid.uark.edu)
- FEB. 1** **Final Scholarship Application Deadline.** Final deadline to be considered for merit awards.
- MAY 1** **Decision Day.** Admitted students **must** register for orientation, sign up for housing, and submit test scores by this date.

## FINANCIAL AID PLANNING

1. Submit the scholarship application by November 15 for priority consideration. ACT or SAT scores are required for scholarships and fellowships.
2. Search for private scholarships through local groups, businesses, places of worship, your school counselor, and sites like [fastweb.com](https://fastweb.com).
3. The Federal Student Aid program is the nation's largest financial aid source. Submit the FAFSA by December 1 for Land of Opportunity and other need-based aid. Dependents need a parent or guardian's tax info. Apply at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov) using the University of Arkansas code: **001108**.
4. Review your FAFSA Submission Summary after processing. It includes your Student Aid Index (SAI) and any next steps to complete.
5. You'll receive an award notice from the University of Arkansas with grants, loans, work-study, and scholarships. Some awards may not be included.

## REQUIRED SCHOLARSHIP DOCUMENTS

### 1. Essay

Write a detailed essay (up to 600 words) on one of three prompts. Be specific and cite any sources.

### 2. Activities

List up to eight key activities (e.g., academic, athletic, leadership, arts, service). Briefly note your role and time commitment for each.

### 3. Awards and Honors

Detail up to five significant academic awards or honors, noting when each was earned.

### 4. Academic Coursework

Indicate the number of competitive courses (Honors, AP, IB, and Dual Enrollment) you have completed or will complete during your senior year.

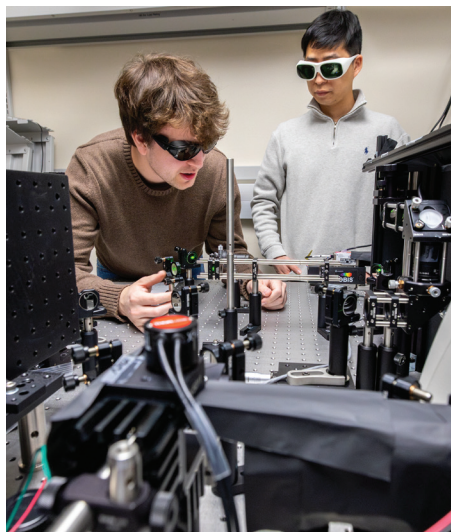
