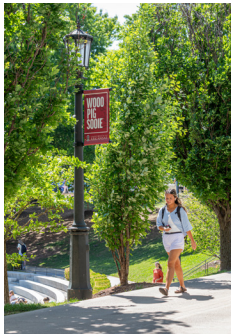

The Razorbacks are one of the nation's most successful athletics programs, with 55 national championships and more than 200 events each year on campus.

Competing in the SEC, Arkansas has won 10 NCAA titles and 43 conference championships in the past eight years. In 2025–26, 106 student-athletes earned their degrees. The Razorbacks represent not just the University of Arkansas, but the pride of the entire state—and the Hog Call is one of the most recognizable (and loudest) traditions in sports.

Arkansas has also achieved six consecutive top-20 finishes in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings, a first in school history.

HOW TO APPLY

If you are applying for the fall semester, see the following steps below. The priority application deadline is **November 1**, and the final application deadline is **August 1**.*

1. Submit your application

Apply at apply.uark.edu by November 1 for priority consideration.

2. Send your transcripts

Ask your high school to send official copies of your transcripts showing all completed academic coursework. Transcripts should be sent through a transcript delivery service or by email to uofa@uark.edu.

3. Submit test scores

Send ACT or SAT scores by February 1 to be considered for merit-based scholarships and fellowships. All test scores must be submitted by May 1 for placement purposes.

GUIDELINES*

Test Optional

Applicants with a 3.20 high school GPA or higher (4.00 scale) will be reviewed for admission without a test score.

Test Required

Applicants with less than a 3.20 high school GPA should submit ACT, SAT, Next Generation Accuplacer, or Classic Learning Test scores at the time of application.

Non-Residents

Out-of-state applicants may be required to meet higher standards, including holistic review, depending on demand.

FINANCIAL AID PLANNING

1. Submit the scholarship application by November 15 for priority consideration. ACT or SAT scores are required for scholarships and fellowships.
2. Search for private scholarships through local groups, businesses, places of worship, your school counselor, and sites like fastweb.com.
3. The Federal Student Aid program is the nation's largest financial aid source. Submit the FAFSA by December 1 to be considered for need-based aid. Dependents need a parent or guardian's tax info. Apply at fafsa.gov using the University of Arkansas code: **001108**.
4. Review your FAFSA Submission Summary after processing. It includes your Student Aid Index (SAI) and any next steps to complete.
5. You'll receive an award notice from the University of Arkansas with grants, loans, work-study, and scholarships. Some awards may not be included.

REQUIRED SCHOLARSHIP DOCUMENTS

1. Essay

Write a detailed essay (up to 600 words) on one of three prompts. Be specific and cite any sources.

2. Activities

List up to eight key activities (e.g., academic, athletic, leadership, arts, service, or work). Briefly note your role and time commitment for each.

3. Awards and Honors

Detail up to five significant academic awards or honors, noting when each was earned.

4. Academic Coursework

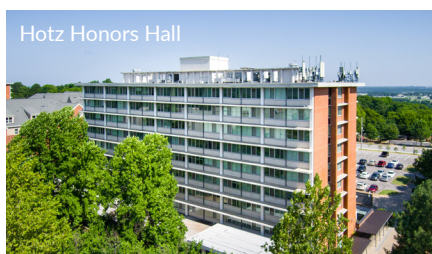

HOUSING

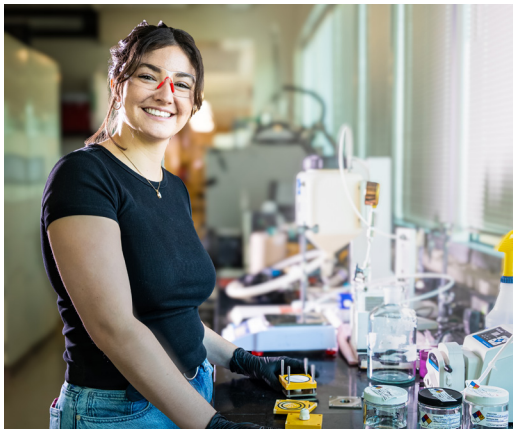
HONORS COLLEGE
