Honors students can apply for competitive grants supporting research, service learning, internships, and study abroad. 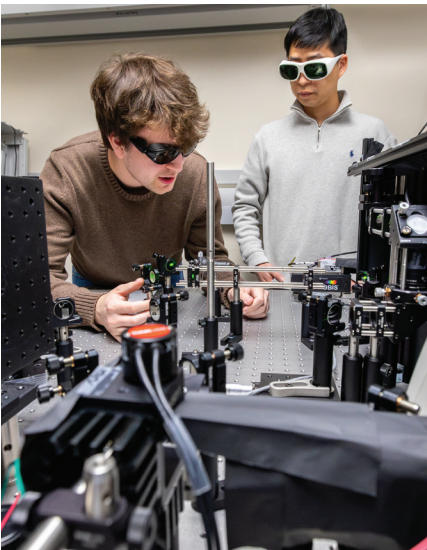
Students will be invited to apply for automatic admission to the Honors College after being admitted to the University of Arkansas.

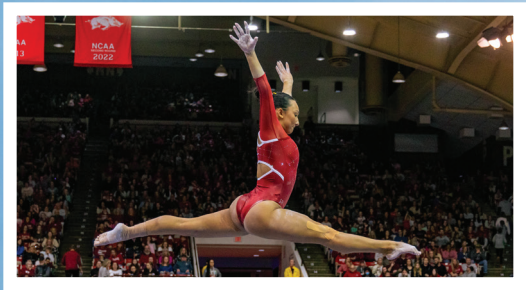
Home of the **RAZORBACKS**®

The University of Arkansas is home to one of the most successful intercollegiate athletics programs in the nation. With 19 varsity sports programs, the Razorbacks consistently rank among the best in the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and nationally.

Razorback student-athletes succeed both on the field and in the classroom. In 2023-24, Arkansas won two NCAA and five SEC championships, recorded nine top-10 national finishes and for the fourth-consecutive year ranked in the top-20 of the Learfield Directors' Cup. In 2023-24, 100% of Razorback student-athletes who completed their athletics eligibility graduated at the University of Arkansas.

The Arkansas Razorbacks don't just represent the University of Arkansas – they are the pride of the entire state. The Hog Call is one of the most unique and recognizable chants in all of sports. And it's loud – really loud. The U of A also hosts a large variety of club and intramural sports, which are some of the most popular student activities. Over 3,000 students each year participate in various organized sports both on campus and against intercollegiate teams.





Applying for Admission

Ready to be a Razorback? Make plans to apply to the University of Arkansas early in your senior year to take advantage of priority scholarship, housing and orientation options.

Admission Process

If you are applying to the University of Arkansas for the fall semester, follow these steps to complete the application process. The priority application deadline is November 1. The final application deadline is August 1.

- 1** Complete an application for admission at apply.uark.edu. Apply by November 1 to take advantage of priority scholarship, housing and orientation options.
- 2** Ask your high school to send your transcript to uofa@uark.edu or by mail to:

- 3** Send your ACT or SAT scores to the U of A no later than February 1 if you wish to be considered for merit-based scholarships and fellowships. All admitted students must provide ACT, SAT or Next Generation Accuplacer scores by May 1 for placement and enrollment.

Admission Guidelines*

Test Optional

Applicants with a 3.20 high school GPA or higher (4.00 scale) will be reviewed for admission without a test score.

Test Required

Applicants with less than a 3.20 high school GPA should submit ACT, SAT or Next Generation Accuplacer scores at the time of application.

Non-Residents

Out-of-state applicants may be required to meet higher standards, including holistic review, depending on demand.

- ✓ **Check In**
Once you are admitted, keep a close eye on your email and New Student Center for important information. Visit appstatus.uark.edu.
- ✓ **Immunization Records**
Submit your immunization records. Learn how at health.uark.edu/immunizations.php.
- ✓ **Housing**
Complete the online housing contract or request to live with a legal guardian. The university requires that all freshmen under the age of 21 live on campus or with guardians during their first year. Visit housing.uark.edu.
- ✓ **New Student Orientation**
Register for New Student Orientation, where you will learn more about life on campus and meet with an academic advisor to sign up for classes. Dates and registration details at orientation.uark.edu.
- ✓ **Final Transcript**
Request that your high school send a final transcript to the University of Arkansas Office of Admissions.

Financial Planning

- 1 Complete the scholarship application no later than November 15 for priority scholarship consideration. ACT or SAT scores are required for scholarship and fellowship consideration.
- 2 Search for private scholarships through local businesses, civic groups, places of worship, and your high school counseling office. Also check websites such as fastweb.com for lists of additional scholarships.
- 3 As the largest provider of student financial aid in the nation, the Department of Education's Federal Student Aid program might be the most worthwhile financial aid program to apply for. New students should complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) no later than December 1 for consideration for Advance Arkansas and other need-based scholarships. If you are a dependent, you will need your parent or guardian's tax information to complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov using the University of Arkansas code: **001108**.
- 4 Review the FAFSA Submission Summary that will be sent to you after your FAFSA is processed. It will include a federally-calculated Student Aid Index (SAI) and outline any additional required steps you should complete.
- 5 Receive your award notice from the University of Arkansas, which may include grants, loans and work-study, as well as merit-based awards and scholarships. This notice may not include all awards.

Scholarships

To be considered for academic scholarships, apply for admission and send in your transcripts and test scores by November 1. Then visit your New Student Center to complete a scholarship application and submit any required supplemental materials by November 15 for priority consideration. If you miss the November 15 deadline, apply by the final deadline of February 1.

Scholarship Application Supplemental Materials

1 Three Works

Include three works that you have read in the past year that you most enjoyed. Write 4-6 sentences on each and its significance to you. Include at least one work that was not required for school.

2 Essay

Write a well-developed essay (max 600 words) on one of three prompts. Be specific and avoid generic statements. Cite any sources used.

3 Activities

Discuss up to eight significant activities, such as academic, athletic, leadership roles, creative endeavors, camps, music/theater involvement, or service projects. Briefly describe your role and time commitment for each.

4 Awards and Honors

Detail up to five significant academic awards or honors, noting when each was earned.

5 Academic Coursework

Indicate the number of competitive courses (Honors, AP, IB, and Dual Enrollment) you have completed or will complete during your senior year.
